# GUIDE TO MOTORHOME AND CAMPERVAN DRIVERS WHEN PARKING AND CAMPING IN DENMARK

For your convenience as a motorhome or campervan driver, here are the most important rules for camping and parking in Denmark.



## **REGULATIONS**

The basic rule is that you must always comply with local signs, and that a motorhome is subject to the same regulations that apply to all other motor vehicles in the given location.



#### **CAMPSITES**

You are allowed to camp, including setting up tables and benches, etc., and stay overnight at a designated campsite, just like other camping quests.



## **MARINAS**

You are allowed to camp, including setting up tables and benches, etc., and stay overnight only if the marina is a designated campsite.

If there is a campsite at or near the marina, this will be clearly indicated by signs or other forms of instructions at the location.

As a motorhome driver, you can park in areas near a marina, just like in other designated parking spaces, provided there are no signs prohibiting parking. Further information on parking is provided in the section below.





#### ROADS AND PARKING AREAS IN CITIES AND URBAN AREAS

In cities and urban areas, you can drive and park on all roads, as long as you comply with the general traffic rules for driving and parking motor vehicles. It is also permitted, while parked, to rest in the sleeping area of the motorhome.

However, if there are specific rules for driving and parking at the given location, you must comply with them. These rules can either be enforced through a local parking ordinance\* (developed by the road authority with police approval), which you need to be aware of, or through signage at the location.

Signs may, for example, dictate the time of day you can park or the type of vehicle that is allowed to park. If, for instance, it is stated that parking is not allowed between 11:00 PM and 7:00 AM, this must be respected.

It is not allowed, in connection with the parking of a motorhome or other motor vehicles, to set up tables and benches, grills, or awnings, etc., without having obtained permission from the road authority.



## GREEN AREAS, SUCH AS BEACHES, FORESTS, PARKS, AND OTHER NATURAL AREAS

Driving and parking motor vehicles on shared private roads or private roads in rural areas is allowed unless otherwise indicated by signs.

Motorhomes, like other motor vehicles, are generally not allowed to drive or park on beaches, in forests, parks, near nature centers, or in other natural areas, unless motorized driving is explicitly allowed.

However, driving on beaches is allowed where it has historically been permitted because the beach was once a public road, e.g., at Vejers and Løkken and on island of Fanø.

It is not allowed, in connection with the parking of a motorhome or other motor vehicles, to set up tables and benches, grills, awnings, or roof tents that allow for overnight stays unless permitted by either signs or other form of granted permission from the landowner.
